

It was 1954 while ice skating at a local pond that a shy young fellow joined the crowd. His resemblance to the new Italian singer, *Julius LaRosa*, had all the girls swooning and vying for his attention, and he was instantly called "Julie." It took almost a month until he asked one of us for a date. I was the lucky one. Two years later in June of 1956 we were married. It took quite a while until

As the years passed and his hair got gray and a few pounds were added he was compared to his look alike *Kenny Rogers*. Instead of Denny, he was called Kenny by all his buddies. That lasted for a short while, but he was still called Julie by old friends.

I could get used to his given name, Dennis.

Later in life while visiting a museum in Key West, FL, Denny was approached by a woman and her daughter who wanted to know where he was from and if he was there for the "Look Alike Contest." Knowing nothing about it, they explained that the town was crowded for the *Ernest Hemingway* look-alike contest and he was sure to get in the finals. These things embarrassed him, but made me proud to be the wife of someone famous. He was very happy to leave Florida before the contest started.



Many years later, the last and most memorable was a stop at a local garage sale. Seeing a mower he wanted Denny roamed around and found no one tending the sale. Hearing a lot of laughter and chatter coming from the back of the house he went around and knocked on the door. All the noise stopped. From the truck where I was sitting I heard almost a scream, "It's Archie Bunker"! And, the noise started again.

He later told me that half a dozen women ran to the door to get a look at "Archie Bunker." He surmised that most of them were tipsy. Once again, he was a look-alike.

Julie, Kenny, Ernest, or Archie, he was always Dennis to me.
